



ICPP-9 Call for Nominations

John Shelnutt Young Investigator Award 2016

Deadline: November 1, 2015

The inaugural **John Shelnutt Young Investigator Award** will be presented at **ICPP-9 in Nanjing, China, July 3-8, 2016**. Prof. Shelnutt was a highly respected and well-liked member of the porphyrin community who made significant contributions in many areas of research including resonance Raman spectroscopy, heme proteins, highly nonplanar porphyrins, and porphyrin-based nanostructures and catalysts. The award is funded by the family and friends of the late Prof. Shelnutt with matching contributions from the *Society of Porphyrins and Phthalocyanines*.^{*} The purpose of the award is to recognize outstanding young scientists in the fields of porphyrin or phthalocyanine research. The winner will present an award lecture and will receive free meeting registration, a plaque of recognition and \$1000 to help cover expenses for participation in the Conference.

All individuals under the age of 40 at the time of the meeting are eligible for the award, which will be evaluated on the basis of the following items:

- a) *Nomination letter (maximum 3 pages)*
- b) *Summary of applicant's current research activities (maximum 2 pages)*
- c) *Curriculum vitae, which includes the name of the applicant's Ph.D. and postdoctoral advisor(s), all appointments held and all publications*
- d) *Two letters of recommendation from people familiar with the work of the candidate.*

Each applicant should arrange to have the nomination packet and letters of recommendation sent by e-mail directly to the **SPP Office in Dijon** (at spp@u-bourgogne.fr) as **PDF files**.

The **deadline for receipt of applications is November 1, 2015** with a decision made by December 1.
